Oshea Luja



Oshea Luja is the Artistic Director of Still Waters Network, the Producer of the Still Waters Experience, and co-founder of the literacy-rooted Still Waters Writers Workshop. A renowned poet and producer, he is a 2015 and 2017 Village Award Recipient from the Villagers Hall of Fame Awards Foundation. Oshea co-founded Vibrations Holistic Center in Inglewood CA and later, The Balance Portal in Southern CA, where he has co-created a line of teas and natural skin and hair care, and helps others explore life-purpose alignment and soul work.

Damon McLeese



Damon is a visionary leader who has dedicated his career to promoting accessibility, inclusion, and innovation in the arts. As the Executive Director of <u>Access Gallery</u> for more than 25 years, Damon has been a driving force behind the organization's success in unlocking the creative power of people regardless of their background, ability, or experience.

Damon's collaborative approach bridges the gap between creativity and community, whether in a corporate setting, senior center or in the classroom. He creates projects that forces us to look at creativity, ability, and disability in very different ways. Projects as diverse as a photography project for people who are blind, a street art project for people with Alzheimer's and dementia.

Grant Avenue Follies



Grant Avenue Follies bring to life the legacy of San Francisco Chinatown's golden nightclub era (1940's to 1970's). Originally comprised of four retired dancers of the nightclubs, they were following doctor's orders to exercise for improved physical health. The Follies rediscovered the sheer joy and freedom of dance and reconnected with their roots.

In 2021, the Follies performed the "Gai Mou Sou Rap" to stand against Anti-Asian hate crimes. Their music video went viral, receiving international attention and was featured in many film festivals. The Follies have since appeared in Steve Harvey's show, "Steve on Watch." A collaboration with AARP led to another viral video, "That Lunar Cheer," and a national TV appearance on Mario Lopez's Access Daily Show. The new PBS arts + culture primetime documentary series, The Express Way with Dulé Hill will feature the Grant Avenue Follies. The series is scheduled to launch in the spring of 2024.
